Applications must be received by the Department at the address below, no later than the last day of the month with a \$40.00 non-refundable application fee per on-site license (cash or check made payable to "Division of Water Resources" is accepted). The completed application will be forwarded for review by the On-Site Systems Advisory Board (Board) on the first Wednesday of the next month. Applications are valid for twelve (12) months from date received.
- 2. Upon application approval by the Board, written, closed-book examinations are given once a month, on the third Thursday of each month at 8:30 a.m. All exams are given in the Richardson and Robbins Building Auditorium, 89 Kings Highway, Dover, DE 19901. If the applicant receives a passing score on their examination (70% or better), the \$40.00 non-refundable application fee (per on-site license) will be applied to the annual \$40.00 license fee.
- 3. All materials required to take the exam(s) will be furnished. However, anyone taking the Class B exam should bring a calculator.
- 4. Applicants are required to show photo identification prior to testing. A driver's license is acceptable.
- 5. Anyone conducting business in the State of Delaware must have a Delaware Business License. Contact the Division of Revenue: New Castle County (302) 571-8200, Kent County (302) 744-1085 or Sussex County (302) 856-5358. Toll free for Delaware only (800) 292-7826.
- 6. Definitions of Licenses

Class A - Percolation Tester: The Class A license authorizes the performance of percolation tests and other types of infiltrometer testing.

Class B – Designer: The Class B license authorizes the design of conventional on-site wastewater treatment and disposal systems which utilize gravity distribution systems for seepage beds and seepage trenches and lift pump stations as provided for in these Regulations.

Class F – Liquid Waste Hauler: The Class F license authorizes the removal or disposal of the solid and liquid contents of septic tanks, cesspools, seepage pits, holding tanks or other wastewater treatment or disposal facilities as specified and required under these Regulations.
